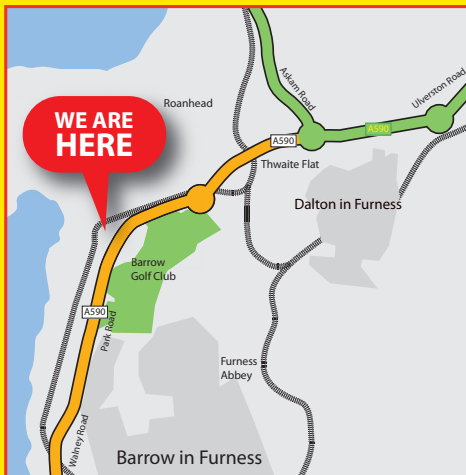
The Furness Owl park is located in over 5 acres of ancient fields and woodland just outside of Barrow-in-Furness, overlooking the beautiful Duddon Estuary.

## Get up Close & Meet the Birds

We have nearly 100 owls from around the world on display at the park. You will get the chance to meet some of the more interesting ones up close and in person.

## Petting Area

Our petting area is a favourite for children who can have fun meeting a selection of locally bred animals including; Angora Goats, Ryeland Sheep, Herdwick Sheep, Kune Kune Pigs, Rabbits and you might even catch sight of an Indian Blue Peacock.



## How to find us...

Furness Owls has its own turning on the main A590, simply stick to this major route until just before you reach Barrow (or just as you are leaving!) and you will spot the Sandscale Park junction where we are situated. We offer visitors ample free parking, light refreshments and a picnic area. There is access for wheelchair users, disabled visitors and pushchairs.

## Helping Endangered Species

With their habitat being continually eroded away, these magnificent Owls are all in imminent danger of becoming endangered species.



The breeding programmes here can help save these Owls from extinction. With a large patch of woodland and specially designed enclosures, we now provide not only a vital conservation service but a hoot of a day out!



## Education

Whilst Furness Owls is dedicated to the conservation and breeding of Owls it also has an ongoing commitment to education. Our gates stand open to welcome the individual, small groups, large groups and school parties keen to share in the world of Owls and participate in their conservation.

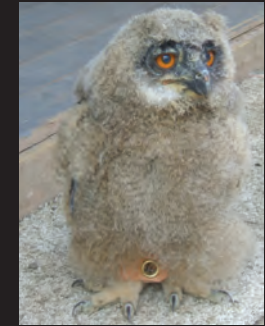
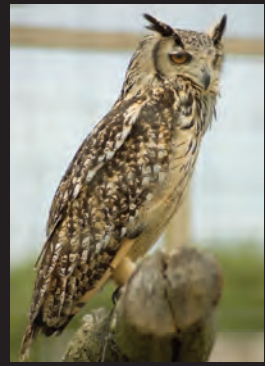
## Friendly, Informative Staff

## Adopt an Owl

Find out more about how you can adopt one of the Furness Owls. At present we are custodians to 21 different protected Owl species, some of which are under threat in the wild.

Our long term aims include the development of fully staffed, specialist hospital and quarantine facilities with charitable status.
